Toonda Cultural Community Center is committed to reducing poverty and improving the quality of life for youth and women in rural Uganda. Through our three core pillars—Women Empowerment, Education, and Arts & Culture—we create opportunities for sustainable development and self-sufficiency.

We believe in helping people help themselves by supporting self-organized community groups. Women's cooperatives in sewing, weaving, and catering generate income, while educational sponsorships and tutoring programs empower the next generation. Our open-air stage, library, and creative spaces foster artistic expression and cultural exchange, bringing together local and international talents.

Tourism initiatives such as drumming, dancing, weaving, and tailoring classes provide additional income for community members, while Airbnb stays help sustain Toonda's projects. Located in Kyakataama, 30 km from Fort Portal, Toonda serves as a vibrant hub where culture, education, and empowerment intersect to build an inclusive and sustainable future.

Women Empowered

Supports 80 single mothers create a stable incomes, through sustainable income-generating initiatives.

- They have formed self-organized groups focused on sewing, basket weaving, and catering for events.
- The women's group is officially registered as a Community-Based Organization (CBO),.
- Local women now produce for TK Maxx.

Arts and Culture exchange.

Fosters artistic and cultural expression through collaborations with local and international artists.

- Delivered a variety of experiences in Art, Dance, Music and Drama

To date: highlights



2024 was a year of growth, resilience, and new opportunities at TOONDA. We finished and opened our community hub with a library with over 1,000 books, creating an inclusive learning space for all ages. Our weaving group reached a milestone by producing items for TK Maxx – a powerful step from training to real income. Ten laptops and a tailored learning app expanded access to digital education for rural youth. One of our proudest moments was Zungu's promotion. He came to TOONDA seven years ago as a boda boda delivery boy – today, through hard work, reliability, and deep commitment to the community, he has become a trusted team leader and project coordinator. Despite financial and structural challenges, we strengthened our network of local partnerships and stayed rooted in community-led development.

Today, we're proud that new projects are coming to us – a sign that our consistent presence, meaningful work, and trustworthiness are being recognized. These milestones reflect our core values: education, empowerment, and creativity. We are deeply grateful to all our supporters who believe in this vision.

It was through his boda boda services that he met Rayka and her husband Eunice and became their most trusted boda. It became quickly visible to them that he had the capcity to do more than driving and deliveries. Because of his pro-active, positively curious, and helpful attitude her was hired to join Toonda as a site manager, before becoming the current general manager. This has not only expanded his professional opportunities, but he has also been able to send his daughter to school.

His mother joined the Women Empowerment group and started to make an income via tailoring and catering, so she could support her family financially.


Additionally, her husband Jonas was hired as project coordinator of Smart Kyakatama and director's assistant.

As a single mother of 6, she was struggling to support her family with no income. She approached Toonda to sponsor her son's education.

After Toonda's sponsorship, she joined the women empowerment group and started saving money with them. She attended leadership workshops and joined the weaving group, which chairperson she became. Meanwhile she's attending english classes at Toonda as well as basic computer skills classes.

Because TOONDA covered the school fees for one of her children, she can now use her own income to support the rest of the family and is taking any chance at the center to learn and grow.

Shafik's Journey

17 years old Shafik grew up without a dad and a mum who decided to live her life in Kampala, irregulary sending money home. His sister helped raising him with the support of the neighbors in the trading center of the village. Due to lack of school fees he was in and out of school. When he came to Toonda he was known to be a teenage troublemaker. So we made him busy with taking over tasks at the center, proving that he can be a responsible young man, once giving trust will try his best to not dissappoint. He quickly found his talent in computer workshops and is now teaching computer classes to digital illiterate neighbors at Toonda. we connected him with a mentor from Tunaweza Innovation Hub, who's counseling him weekly. His aim is to start a digital based business, together with his mentor he's working on his self-development and is gaining more skills to reach his goal.

This has changed my life in ways she never imagined. I have been so inspired by the kindness and perseverance that shaped my own path, I hope to eager to pay it forward and help others overcome similar struggles.





Suzan's Journey

The youngest child of 16 kids to her parents and on the verge of dropping out of school due to fees, she joined the educational support programme Smart Kyakatama at Toonda. Through the programme, she connected with generous individuals who supported her schooling. With this help, Suzan was able to continue her education and recently completed her Senior 6 level certificate program in Building and Construction.



Lessons Learned.

Tailoring Group: The group struggled to attract new learners who could contribute financially to cover materials. Without enough participants, the group couldn't continue.

Literacy Group: Our literacy class faced irregular attendance, which made consistent teaching difficult and eventually led to a pause.

Education Sponsorship: Since Covid local schools raised tuition almost every term, which reached a level for our sponsors, where they couldn't increase their support. This threatened our ability to continue helping all children. We negotiated with school directors to keep fees stable for our sponsored students.



Insights gained...

- Community outreach must be ongoing and varied. In future, we aim to link vocational groups more directly to income opportunities to boost participation.
- Adult learners need more flexible formats and motivational incentives.
 We're exploring more informal, interest-based learning sessions moving forward.
- Transparent dialogue and local partnerships can offer low-cost solutions. In future, we'll engage earlier and build emergency buffers.


